



## 2021 Horse Show Rates, Rules, and Expectations

### 2021 Rates

Horse Show Coaching: \$100 per weekend, \$120 if fewer than 3 students attend  
Schooling Day Lessons: \$45 or will replace “missed” lesson if student’s normal lesson day is during the show weekend  
Trainer Lodging: split among clients  
School Horse Lease: \$75 per weekend  
Trailer: pro-rated round trip  
Camden: \$30  
Aiken: \$85  
Raeford/Tryon: \$125  
Conyers: \$150

### Show Prep & Care

Mane Pulling: \$15  
Trimming: \$15 includes ears, face, and legs  
Body Clipping: \$125 pony, \$150 horse if done in house; vendors at their own rates  
Day Care: includes any care the horse may need if the rider is not present, including loading, unloading, watering, feeding, wrapping, stall cleaning, and hand walking  
Half Day: \$35  
Full Day: \$70  
ForeCalm Paste: \$10 per serving  
Banamine, Bute, Ace, SMZs, Naquazone, Dex, medical supplies: at cost

### Rules & Expectations

- Invoices will be sent for coaching, lodging splits, trailering, Farm golf carts, shavings if applicable, and stalls if applicable two weeks prior to the horse show. These fees must be paid in advance of the show in order for students to attend. Invoices for any additional services once at the show (schooling, day care, medications, etc) will be sent the week following the show and are due on receipt.
- Trailer spaces will be saved when hauling fee is paid in full.
- Once entries have been sent (typically two weeks in advance), if you are unable to attend the show, you will still be responsible for hauling, coaching, lodging split, and tack stall split unless your spot can be filled. Some shows will charge for the show stall as well if scratched after a certain date.



- There are limited spots on trailers. First priority will be given to riders without their own means of transportation. If there are no available spaces, riders with their own trailers will need to haul their own horses.
- Riders are responsible for their mount for the entirety of the weekend, including packing equipment and feed, loading and unloading, stall maintenance, feeding, watering, handwalking, wrapping, and grooming.
- Feed bags for each horse including supplements and medications should be packed on the trailer by 6pm the Thursday night before a horse show, along with tack and equipment. Saddles, bridles, and girths should always accompany the horse in the trailer if the rider's trunk and other belongings will be coming later.
- If a rider is unable to load the horse and accompany it to a horse show, Day Care rates will apply. If rider is unable to unload the horse at home, a \$20 fee will be added to the post-show invoice for unloading the horse, taking off boots/wraps, and turning out.
- Tack and equipment will need to be unloaded and trailers will need to be cleaned on the Monday following horse shows.
- Riders will be paired or teamed up at horse shows to assist each other in caring for their horses and preparing to show. Parents are encouraged to allow riders to do tasks on their own or with their partner, helping only when absolutely necessary.
- Sportsmanship is of utmost importance. Poor sportsmanship by riders or parents may result in suspension. Examples of poor sportsmanship include talking badly about horses or riders, complaining loudly about the judging or placings, putting down other riders, etc. Taking frustration out on the horses will not be tolerated at all and will result in the rider being scratched from any remaining classes.
